The German team didn't make it to the World Cup finals. Weren't you still impressed by the performance of the German team? We found them extremely team oriented, modest, introvert und energetic during the games. What interested us was the fact; what we could learn from the management and leadership practices of the players of this Championship. A study found that most of the extremely successful managers are modest and in terms of personality rather dull — simply not charismatic people or lone wolfs. What are the distinguishing factors of the management work in German team?

World Cup 2010 in South Africa

Excellent team selection: the talented players are identified and nurtured in Talent Centres (potential assessment in the economy). Then the "right-ones" are selected.

The Team: The trainer puts in great amount of time and energy in developing the team and thereby focuses away from himself. The philosophy is that the team must win and not individual stars. This has also been emphasised by each player in every interview.

Specialists for support: 27 people are involved, from psychologists to physicians, to fitness trainers and even a chief scout, who analysis the team; all that goes into achieving success.

Leadership: The National Trainer breaks new ground with unconventional and diverse mix of players. He doesn't heed to the sceptics and always stands by his players. He emphasises on the performance and not so much on the uniqueness of each individual player.

Diversity management: A conscious choice was made to select roughly half of the players with migrant background, simply for the fact that they played excellent football. They were selected for their performance. The exciting fact being; apparently they weren't considered earlier and thus talents were excluded.

Strategy and tactics: They were rotated; every player changed positions so that in ideal circumstances the ball moves from one player to another, as and when the opportunities arise. To achieve that objective you need the whole team to be physically fit and not just individual stars.
